OUR CHALLENGES

Mangere Bridge Village Association is a small BID with under 50 members. As the previous top up grant is now contestable we have no surety around funding moving forward. Income from the Sunday market is good but size limits our ability to expand the market without incurring more costs via the council. The number of markets has also increased which makes it difficult to retain or recruit new stallholders. The good weather this summer as been a bonus with no cancellations.

Crime and safety in the village and community

The village has had attempted Ram Raids at the Vape shops. Burglaries at the Post Shop, Hong Kong Bakery, Bridge Beauty, Mini Mart Vape shop and fresh choice has had two Ram Raids and a large increase in theft, shoplifting, full trolley thefts. We also have again increased activity from mental health patients living in community housing, begging, anti social behaviour. Dirt Bike riders (helmetless), Teen cyclists on footpaths and middle of the road. The community is consistently hit with Car thefts and Break ins, Garage thefts, opportunistic theft and burglaries. Gang drive through on bikes and anti social behaviour is on the increase.

Coronation Rd Cycle lanes (In Trial)

The Business Association, Local Businesses and the community continue to be concerned and against the proposal to install cycle lanes down Coronation Road and remove half of the on-street parking.

A current trial is ongoing taking cyclists from the bridge along Coronation Rd, diverting cyclists along Church Road via Woodward to see if this is a viable alternative. There are some residents who are against this idea.

There is considerable concern from business owners and residents of the issues with traffic, Boaties with trailers (regular shoppers on their way to & from the boat ramp have nowhere to stop with trailer in tow.

Rubbish Issues

The village, the waterfront, the causeway and the boat ramp continue to experience major littering issues. Along with local dumping behind local business and beside roads and parks. We are fortunate we have three residents who appear to be doing the job of council and citizens, by early morning sojourns to clear the areas of rubbish long before council turn up to do the job. The removal of rubbish bins across the local board area and greater Auckland will have a detrimental effect on the environment, our harbours and waterways and the amenity of the local areas and neighbourhoods. Rubbish is one of council's basic responsibilities and greater attention and expenditure should be placed on this role not less. Rubbish before cycle ways.

Bridge and Causeway Issues

We are pleased to see the developments in this area with a trial to a trial been run with security guards and a temporary gate been put in place to see if this has an impact on the night issues down at the boat ramp and causeway

ASB Bank Closure


We are very disappointed that the ASB bank without any consultation has decided to close the branch completely in January. Kate has been liaising with the ASB bank to provide lessons for customers with their internet banking and ATM's.

Exposing vulnerable and elderly residents to both online scammers, daylight robbery, plus giving some a great deal of concern and worry on what they have known for so long been taken away in such an abrupt manner.

Travelling to Onehunga is just not possible for some elderly residents, parking is not easy and nor is public transport.

Council service contracts

The drop in service to all the local amenities and assets in the community is concerning. We have a level 1 Park "Bill and Naomi Kirk Park" that looks unkempt with lawns left unmown till they are almost 8 inches high. Edges are no longer done when the grass is mown and done without a catcher. This park sits in the middle of the village. Whilst more salubrious suburbs continue to receive the previous high level of service. Planted gardens, neat and tidy parks. Why have our service levels dropped, when it is apparent others are being treated differently. We should all receive the same standard of care. The further you move away from the CBD the less inviting and cared for the city becomes.



SECURITY patrols and CCTV circuit

• Cameras are working well but aging. We have been fortunate not to have any thefts of equipment in the past 12 months. We continue to ensure that they are anti theft and vandal proof so this is working well for us.

• We have an increase of police requests for footage, which has been valuable to them for the solving and prosecution of crimes.

• We have a strong relationship with the local community policing team and if we have any issues we are supported by them.

• Security Patrols continue throughout the village each night.

• Fresh choice have a portable camera tower situated in the Fresh Choice car park area. This camera has an alarm & siren. If anyone approaches any of the entrances to the supermarket or liquor store the camera will activate, an alarm will be sent to Kate and the camera operator and a Siren will sound. This is now funded by Fresh Choice.

• Funding, maintaining and upgrading the system is a constant area of concern particularly as the system has proven its worth with the minimization of incidences.

Art Spaces: To work with Auckland council and the Local Board to create an art centred environment in the village and along the foreshore to enhance both the cycling and walking opportunities here in Mangere Bridge.

Works in progress:

- Historic Trail walk-New Bridge to village and on to Mangere Mountain - In Planning
- Second Whale Tail seeking artist and designs In Planning

Mangere Bridge Half Marathon, 5,10,21 Kms plus a walk September 2023. Another great success with numbers increasing each year Our total numbers doubled from the previous event. There were runners in the half marathon and the feedback wad there will be more next year from the current runners who really enjoyed the run and the atmosphere. We see this event growing in popularity from year to year with the start and finish occurring in the immediate village area. The income from this event continues to grow. We will soon be at a stage where income/ profit for the event will go to the Business association for other community initiatives.

Destination Water Park: Whilst this is not at the forefront of any plans we still believe that with the completion of the New bridge and Panuku future development of the Onehunga port is this is something that would ensure that the area on both sides of the harbour is on everyone destination visit plans. We envisage a waterpark with funding to be provided by way of grants from charitable community organisations. We ask the local board that it be placed in the long term plan where appropriate.

Thank you to the Local board for the funding to assist in the forming of a MBCSG. The goal is to create our own independent civil defence action plan, including a crime safety plan, plus community environment and safety action group.
